FAITH

God has some pretty definite ideas about “faith” – without faith it is impossible to please God, (Hebrews 11:6), and faith without works is dead. (James 2:26).

So – what is “faith”?

Faith is described in the bible as “the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen”. (Hebrews 11:1)

This was unpacked so nicely in a teaching I heard recently from Asher Intrater from Revive Israel.

“Faith is all the qualities of strength of heart that God wants to see in us” e.g. faithfulness, trustworthiness, and integrity.

It is the belief that God created all that is seen, from what is not seen – i.e everything physical was firstly invisible spiritual substance, before becoming visible, physical substance.

Asher likened it to two pools: the invisible spiritual pool is full of water, the visible physical pool is empty. We draw the fullness into our emptiness. Every need and desire in our lives has a real, legitimate fulfilment ready for us to draw upon from Heaven.

How do we draw upon this “bank account” in heaven? Just by believing that God has already given us access to the total treasure of Heaven through Jesus: “He did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him up for us all – **how shall He not with Him freely give us all things?**”

We believe that God is good – out of the fullness of His heart He spoke by faith and created the world, the universe - all things.

Consider the breathtaking beauty that is woven into our world, and know that it came forth out of the beauty of God’s heart, spoken into being by His words!

God is good!

Consider the heavens, the moon and the stars: the work of His hands and know that God is awesome!

Consider the most spectacular, the pinnacle of all His creative goodness – a precious human being – millions of atoms rightly aligned into skeleton, connective tissue, muscles, blood vessels, heart, brain and lungs and all the intricate, interrelated systems that we simply take for granted.

The same God who made all things, upholds all things, sustains all things and has available all things for those who trust Him.

As we ponder this unseen realm, and it becomes more real to us, hope begins to awaken within us. When hope fills our hearts then we have access to the substance of heaven, we draw it into our lives, speaking it into being in the physical realm through the soundwaves of our own voices.

END TIMES MADE SIMPLE

Revive Israel

Three major events in the end times will soon be approaching.

They may be summarized as:

1. Tribulation: a series of worldwide difficulties which culminate in an international attack on Israel (Matthew 24). The term “tribulation” is connected to the time of Jacob’s “trouble” in the Hebrew prophets (Jeremiah 30:7, Daniel 12:1). During this time there is not only difficulty but also revival, evangelism, supernatural protection, purification of the Church, and the restoration of Israel.

2. Second Coming: which occurs at the peak moment of that war when Jerusalem is about to be overwhelmed by enemy forces (Zechariah 14). The Second Coming is a “last minute” intervention by Jesus as commander of the armies of God to defeat the forces of evil (Revelation 19). At that time, demons will be driven out, the dead of the first resurrection raised, and true believers supernaturally “transported” to welcome Yeshua back to earth.

3. Millennium: The Kingdom of God on earth for 1,000 years of peace and prosperity with Jesus ruling as King (Revelation 20). After this Great War, the Messianic kingdom (Millennium) will start. Jerusalem will be the political and spiritual capital of the world. The government will be led by Jesus and those who will rule together with Him. There will be great peace, prosperity, and justice in this righteous society.

During the first century, three main events also took place in the spring holy days:

1. Passover - The Crucifixion of Jesus
2. First Fruits - the Resurrection of Jesus
3. Feast of Weeks, Pentecost - the outpouring of the Holy Spirit

It would be biblically logical therefore that the events of the end times would take place on the three autumn holy days. We could summarize the connection of the autumn holy days and the end times:

1. Trumpets - Tribulation
2. Atonement - Second Coming of Jesus
3. Tabernacles - Millennium

The world political-economic-social situation is

already leading up to these events. Jesus compared this process to a woman in labour. The pains start out light with more time between them; and then they become more intense and more quickly placed (John 16:21).

It is urgent that we repent and strengthen our faith to be able to stand in victory during the times before us.

From the *Camden News* Thu 14 July 1898

The members of the Menangle Amateur Dramatic Club are to be congratulated on the great success that attended their plain and fancy dress ball, which was held in the local hall on Tuesday, 5th inst. and was unquestionably the best yet given in this village. About 40 couples were present, and one and all seemed to thoroughly enjoy themselves, dancing being kept up with vigour until the early hours of the morning to music supplied by Messrs Williamson (piano) and Kitchen (violin). Supper was provided about midnight when the wants of the various guests were well catered for by the ladies of Menangle in their usual engaging manner. The supper room had been beautifully decorated and reflected great credit on the artistic taste of Mrs. Stanner, Misses Hickey, Payten and Stanner, assisted by Messrs. T. Quirk, Maher and J. Hickey. The scene in the hall during the dancing made a very pretty picture, the splendid dresses and colours worn by the ladies blending with the uniforms and fancy costumes worn by the gentlemen having a very fine effect. During the evening the hall was visited by Captain A. J. O. Thompson, and Lieutenants George, John and Arthur Onslow in the men's uniform of N.S.W. Mounted Rifles.
